Review: Autumn 2025

At St Joseph the Worker, we place our children at the centre of our school and seek to develop the whole child – spiritually, morally, culturally and academically so they are well prepared to meet future challenges.

Rationale

As a catholic primary school, we believe parents are the first educators of their children. We also believe that a strong home, school, parish partnership is fundamental to the development of children. Pupils whose parents are involved with their education make better progress throughout their school life. Home learning encourages parents to work with their children as well as in partnership with the school.

Homework partnerships with teachers, parents, and pupils should provide the children with opportunities for increased high-quality learning beyond the limits of the school day. Homework should help the children to develop the skills and attitudes they will need for successful, independent lifelong learning.

The Purpose of Homework

- To give children opportunities to consolidate and reinforce knowledge, skills and understanding, particularly in literacy and numeracy.
- To develop a partnership with parents and involve them actively in their child's learning and progression.
- To promote learning and enquiry
- To encourage older pupils to develop the confidence and self discipline needed to study on their own.

Procedures

- There is consistent practice across the school in setting, managing and marking homework.
- There is a regular programme so that teachers, children and parents know what to expect each week.
- Homework is included in teachers' planning wherever possible.
- Teachers have agreed and timetabled the subjects for which homework will be set in each year group.
- Homework is directly related to work that the children have been doing in school.
- Pupils and parents are clear about what they have to do. Guidelines for assisting children with their homework are made known to parents by each teacher.
- Teachers have agreed an amount of time to be devoted to homework in each Year Group.
- There are high expectations of pupils in completing homework and submitting it to their class teacher by the agreed deadline.

- Wherever possible homework should be uploaded via Teams and be suitable for children to complete and record in their homework books.
- Each half term, teacher will set a grid of the homework tasks for that half term. Children will be given the choice of which task they wish to complete each week with the expectation that they complete all tasks by the end of the half term. This gives children ownership over their learning and teaches responsibility.
- It is expected that all children read at home daily.
- It is expected that children practise spelling words set by the class teacher at home.
