Arithmetic practice tests Attached on the class page under 'Maths resources' are arithmetic practice assessments for Summer 2. Please complete the test questions in your homework books. <i>Not everything on the assessment would have been covered in class until the end of this term but it is good for the children to start with the ones they have learned so far.</i>	Artwork: Festival Feasts Create a piece of artwork based on the theme "Festival Feasts." Explore how food is used in celebrations around the world and use this as inspiration for your artwork. You could draw, paint, collage, print, or create a mixed-media piece showing a festive meal, special foods, or a celebration that brings people together. Think carefully about the colours, patterns, textures, and details you include to make your artwork vibrant and eye-catching. You may wish to research foods from different cultural or religious festivals to inspire your work.	How do different liquids flow? Investigate how different liquids flow. Compare water, honey, syrup, washing-up liquid or any other liquids you can find in your home. Make sure to record your results in your book and explain what you notice. <i>Challenge: Create a poster explaining what makes some liquids flow faster than others.</i>

The importance of St Paul Research the life of St Paul and create a timeline showing the most important events in his life. Include key moments such as his early life as Saul, his conversion on the road to Damascus, his missionary journeys, and the letters he wrote to early Christian communities. This can be a poster, booklet, or digital presentation and include pictures, maps, or illustrations to make your work engaging and informative.	The Power of Speaking Up: Comic strip Create a comic strip that shows a situation where there is a problem, such as someone being left out or treated unfairly. Show how a character notices the problem and chooses to speak up respectfully to help make a difference. Make sure you are showing how speaking up can help solve problems, support others, and create a positive outcome. Think carefully about who the character could talk to and how their actions help make things better for everyone.	Blue John: Design a new front cover Design a new front cover for Blue John. Make sure to include pictures and a blurb explaining why someone should read it. <i>Challenge: If you would like to extend this activity you can write a diary entry as Blue John describing the day Blue John woke up. The children will bring reading books home weekly. Books must be brought to school every day. Please ensure your child reads every day and that they are keeping a record of what they have read in their reading diary. Parents, please sign to say your child has read each evening. <i>Challenge: If you would like to extend this activity you can complete a book review with 3 reasons why someone may want to read the book you've just read.</i>	A new spelling rule will be introduced weekly. Please ensure that spellings are practised frequently. Spelling tests will take place on Fridays. <i>Challenge: If you would like to extend this activity you can write spelling sentences. This consists of writing a sentence including 1 spelling in each sentence.
